Thank you for choosing the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts Day Camp!

This summer, daycampers will get the chance to thoroughly explore the Museum through fun and exciting tours aimed at stimulating their imagination and creativity. They will see the summer's major exhibition, *Portable Universe: Thought and Splendour of Indigenous Colombia* and will immerse themselves in projects based on what inspires them.

In this unique day camp, the children will travel across time and styles as they discover the myriad artists and works in the MMFA's collections. Back in the studio, they will be encouraged to express themselves using a variety of creative techniques, themes and methods. They will also carry out two- and three-dimensional projects using all sorts of materials in a relaxed atmosphere. At the end of the week, the children will present their artwork to their friends and family in an exhibition that they mount themselves. Arrival (Monday morning from 8 a.m.)

Check-in will be done by DEW employees, who will verify the child/parent's file and distribute day camp T-shirts. Children will be grouped according to age and ratios.



Arrival and departure

2075 Bishop Street (the Michal and Renata Hornstein Pavilion for Peace). Written authorization is required for children to leave the Museum alone or with another adult.

Late fees

After 5:30 p.m., \$10 will be charged for each delay of 15 minutes.

Snapshot of the day

8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.: check-in and daycare service (included in the package);

9 a.m. to 4 p.m.: activities, including lunch and 2 breaks;

Monday to Thursday, 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.: daycare service;

Friday, 4 p.m.: Vernissage of children's artwork. Please bring a large bag to take the artwork home.

Food

Please provide a cold lunch and two snacks. There is no refrigerator, so we suggest including a cold pack in the lunch box. Peanuts and nuts are forbidden.

Visit to the park after lunch for outdoor games

An outing to the park is planned, weather permitting. Sunscreen and a sunhat are recommended.



Clothing

We recommend that children wear washable clothing and bring a change of clothes in case of an accident. The Museum is air conditioned so it's a good idea to send along a sweater or sweatshirt. We also recommend running shoes.

Medication

If your child needs to take medication, please fill out and sign the medication form on Monday morning at the drop-off. Prescription medication must be in the original packaging.

Special needs

It is essential that you inform us prior to registration, in writing or verbally by telephone, of your child's specific needs so we can ensure that they are adequately met.

Cancellation policy

Day Camp registrations cancelled 10 or more business days before the first day of the session reserved will be refunded in full, minus a \$50 administration fee. No refunds will be granted for cancellations made less than 10 business days before the start of a session, unless they are made for medical reasons. In such cases, registration fees will be refunded in full upon presentation of a doctor's note.
